Actor Spotlight: Jonelle Meyer

Jonelle Meyer, who is currently playing Deborah in *There's a Burglar in My Bed*, is a natural comedic talent. She was born and raised in New York. Her father was always interested in the entertainment industry and worked for NBC. With the help of her father, Jonelle began her acting career by putting on shows in the family basement when she was six years old.

The family moved to Orlando, Florida when Jonelle was nine, and she performed in her first musical in the third grade. Jonelle remembers being sick before the show and missing some rehearsals, but she nailed her song "Go West Young Man," and was happy when her Principal told her what a lovely voice she had.

In High School, Jonelle participated in drama classes, and also learned a lot about the technical side of theatre, which is a valuable asset for any actor.

Jonelle knew she enjoyed entertainment, but wasn't sure

which area she would focus on until she went to College.

When one of her friends wanted to audition for the Florida School of the Arts in Palatka, Jonelle decided on a whim to go along and audition. It wasn't until after she was accepted and attended the College, that Jonelle knew she had found her calling. She credits her amazing teachers for their talent and guidance.

Jonelle says, "I prefer live theatre over film, because of the immediate reaction of the audience, especially with comedy. I love being able to create something that makes others forget whatever is going on in their lives, and being a part of impacting them in a positive way."

She also enjoys working with other actors, who have the same goals and who care about their work and strive to keep the integrity of the play intact. Theatre is also cathartic for Jonelle. She can take experiences from her life and use them in her characters. Jonelle adds, "Theatre can be an outlet that is rejuvenating no matter what is going on in an actor's personal life."

After College, Jonelle moved to Tampa where many of her theatre friends lived. She first met Robin New at the Old Carrollwood Players when Robin attended her performance, as Suzette in *Don't Dress for Dinner*. Robin approached her after the show and asked Jonelle to audition for Early Bird.

Since they first met, Jonelle says, "Robin has always given me confidence as an actor. She's a fun director, who gives her actors the creative freedom to explore their characters, and

she has become a good friend."

Jonelle credits Robin for helping her get her start doing what she loves to do and getting paid for it. "If it wasn't for Robin," Jonelle says, "I'm not sure where I'd be in the theatre community now."

While Jonelle prefers comedy, she has performed a wide variety of roles in the Tampa Bay area. She appeared as Sally Talley in Stagework's production of *Talley's Folly*, a dramatic two person show, and in another drama *How I Learned to Drive*, playing the role of Lil' Bit.

Some of Jonelle's favorite roles have been Maureen in *Hotbed Hotel* at the Early Bird, where her comedic talent had the cast, as well as the audience, in hysterics. She also enjoyed playing Anelle in the Early Bird production of *Steel Magnolias*. Another favorite role was in Hat Trick's production of *Funny Money* where she played the role of Jean.

Jonelle says, "Working at Early Bird Dinner Theatre is always fun. Farce is my favorite kind of show, particularly the roles where I can combine both silly and sexy characteristics." She is thankful to Ed Fletcher and Robin New for being invited back to Early Bird so often.

"Early Bird feels like home," adds Jonelle, "and I love feeling so welcome here."

Jonelle's natural talent for comedy always raises the level for all the actors in a show. Her sense of humor is in action both onstage and off, which makes working with her a delightful and fun experience.

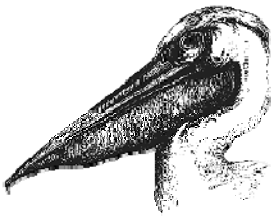
